#### Letter from the President

Dear Friends of Private and Independent Schools,

As everyone prepares for the impending school year, listed below are several resources to aid schools in a safe return to school. Think of this as the **"back to school" packet** schools send to families prior to the first day of school. We know these may not answer EVERY question, but we hope these will assist in your planning and implementation of a return to school.

#### Mask mandate

Governor Walz's <u>Executive Order 20-81</u> applies to all indoor settings, which includes K-12 schools across all sectors. There have been several questions related to slight inconsistencies in the EO and MISF, in partnership with several others, has requested clarity on portions related to presenters, teachers, etc. We will provide an update as warranted.

#### **MN Department of Education resources**

Last week, MDE issued updated guidance regarding <a href="nonpublic pupil transportation">nonpublic pupil transportation</a> in various learning models. For many schools, transportation is the largest hurdle to overcome in a return to school plan. MISF has communicated with MDE and legislators on this new guidance, including the cumbersome and inequitable situation this causes for private and independent schools. Note, the guidance DOES allow nonpublic schools to work with their district and contract directly with a private company to handle transportation of students in the varied learning models. MISF will provide further updates.

#### **CARES Act guidance (ESSER/GEER funds)**

MDE has issued new guidance for ESSER/GEER funds and nonpublic equitable services <a href="https://education.mn.gov/MDE/dse/health/covid19/cares/">https://education.mn.gov/MDE/dse/health/covid19/cares/</a>. Based on this new guidance, LEAs must select one of three options to follow during calculation and implementation. IF you have met with your LEA already, MISF suggests reconnecting with the district to learn which option they have chosen. If you have not heard from or consulted with your LEA on equitable services for your school, contact Alicia Waeffler, Nonpublic Ombudsman, Alicia.waeffler@state.mn.us. MISF is willing to walk you through these new stipulations.

#### **Solar Suitcase Capstone Project (2020-2021) for 9-12 Grade Students**

#### Interdisciplinary STEM & Social Studies Curriculum



The Solar Suitcase Capstone Project 2020-2021 is a pilot program for 9-12 grade students. The program is interdisciplinary with a science and a social studies unit that can be delivered via team-teaching, or by a single teacher focused on environmental science. It is a 2-3 week in-class or out-of-class program that can be delivered in person or by virtual access.

- Lessons focus on how solar works and the role that solar can play in the world of energy access.
- Students will build a stand-alone solar system, learning about user-centered design, innovation, and social entrepreneurship.
- The solar system built by the students will be deployed to light a school for refugee children
- Social studies lessons focus on the United Nations Sustainability Development Goals, global energy access and life in Uganda...particularly as a refugee.

- 11 MISF member schools will be chosen to participate

- Curriculum will provide approximately 10 15 STEM lessons and 5 10 Social Studies lessons
